










The BEC + BRIDGE show during the Afterpay Australian Fashion Week 2023 at the Overseas Passenger Terminal on May 16, 2023.

How did you get into the modelling industry?

After having a read, they agreed to take me, so we submitted all the forms. I learned the monologue they sent me, and off we went.

We didn't realize that the company was a U.S. Talent Scouting Agency, and that the two scouts were well-known actors and models. I was initially there to audition for acting, but they both encouraged me to audition as a model. So I did, and I made it through and was off to Las Vegas to take part in IPOP, where I learned so much, met a lot of industry professionals, made a heap of friends, and completely fell in love with the industry.

What do you like most about being a model?

I honestly love everything about being a model, from modelling beautiful designer creations to the adrenaline and excitement of the runway and all the fun and amazing locations of photoshoots. But if I had to choose one, it would have to be the fantastic people I get to meet and work with. I get to make new friends every time I go to work.

Downside to being a model?



I have had the privilege to meet and work with many amazing photographers, videographers, actors, stylists, HMU Artists, models, and designers. 
















Sheridan Mortlock


